RE: CACV 9/19 - LAUGHTON v MARSH & Anor

I refer to the appellant's case dated 26 February 2019. The appellant's case has been referred to the Registrar.

The Registrar advises that the appellant's case does not comply with rule 32 of the *Supreme Court (Court of Appeal) Rules 2005* and has not been accepted for filing.

The grounds of appeal must state the grounds, and concise particulars of the grounds, in separately numbered paragraphs and identify the errors alleged to have been made by the primary court (Rule 32(4)). It must state for each ground, whether it is an error of fact; an error of law; or an error of mixed fact and law.

The grounds of appeal must identify by reference to the paragraph number or page number of the reasons of the primary court ([2018] WADC 172), each passage where an error is alleged to occur.

If an error of fact is alleged, which requires the Court of Appeal to undertake a review of the evidence, the appellant must comply with Practice Direction 7.4.

The grounds of appeal cannot contain a statement that "This has not been proof read by a lawyer, and once it has been it may be updated". Once an appellant's case has been accepted for filing, it requires the leave of the Court to amend it.

The submissions must contain the written submissions (or argument) for each ground of appeal (Rule 32(5)). The submissions should contain headings which identify (by number) the grounds of appeal to which they relate. Any evidence in support of a ground of appeal should be referenced in the submissions and included in the draft green appeal book index.

The legal authorities must list each principal legal authority to which the appellant wishes to refer the Court (Rule 32(6)). The authorities should be listed under these headings in this order:

- (i) "Written laws"
- (ii) "Judgments"
- (iii) "Legal texts".



The legal authorities should not contain any commentary.

The draft chronology must state succinctly in numbered paragraphs arranged in date order the date and facts of each event that is material to the appeal (Rule 32(8)).

The draft appeal book indexes must be completed in accordance with Rule 38. It is not sufficient to attach incomplete sample indexes.


In the circumstances, the Registrar has granted an extension of time to 21 March 2019 to file and serve the appellant's case.
